He's a music teacher, and a few years ago he showed me a video of a show he'd put on at a school camp. I saw how well the kids reacted to him and it looked like a lot of fun, so we decided to do something together for our daughter Caitlin's birthday party.

That was the beginning of the Fabulous Lemon Drops. Dez had always written songs for adults, so I suggested having a go at writing for kids. I mainly write the lyrics but the music just comes out of Dez's head. He dreams songs, wakes up and records them on a little tape recorder.

Friends who don't work with their husbands think I'm mad, but we like being in each other's company.

HE SAYS:

When the band I was in started to come to an end, it was Vanessa who encouraged me to get a teaching qualification. I think it's really important in a relationship to support and encourage each other and we do that.

After Caitlin's birth, Il years ago, we came on holiday to Australia and I absolutely loved it – I'm from rainy Bradford and I'd never have thought I'd end up living in Brisbane on a 1012sq m block with a white picket fence, but I do consider myself very blessed. Brisbane's a fantastic place for our daughter to grow up.

Caitlin has helped sing backing vocals on a couple of our songs but she's a bit over us now.

Writing music for children with the Fabulous Lemon Drops was a steep learning curve after being in a rock band for so long, but children are so responsive to music. It's a fantastic thing when you have a room full of children singing and dancing to a song you've written.

Vanessa's really kind and very funny. We've been together quite a while now, but we always have things to talk about – that helps sustain any relationship. And I think she's just extraordinary.
